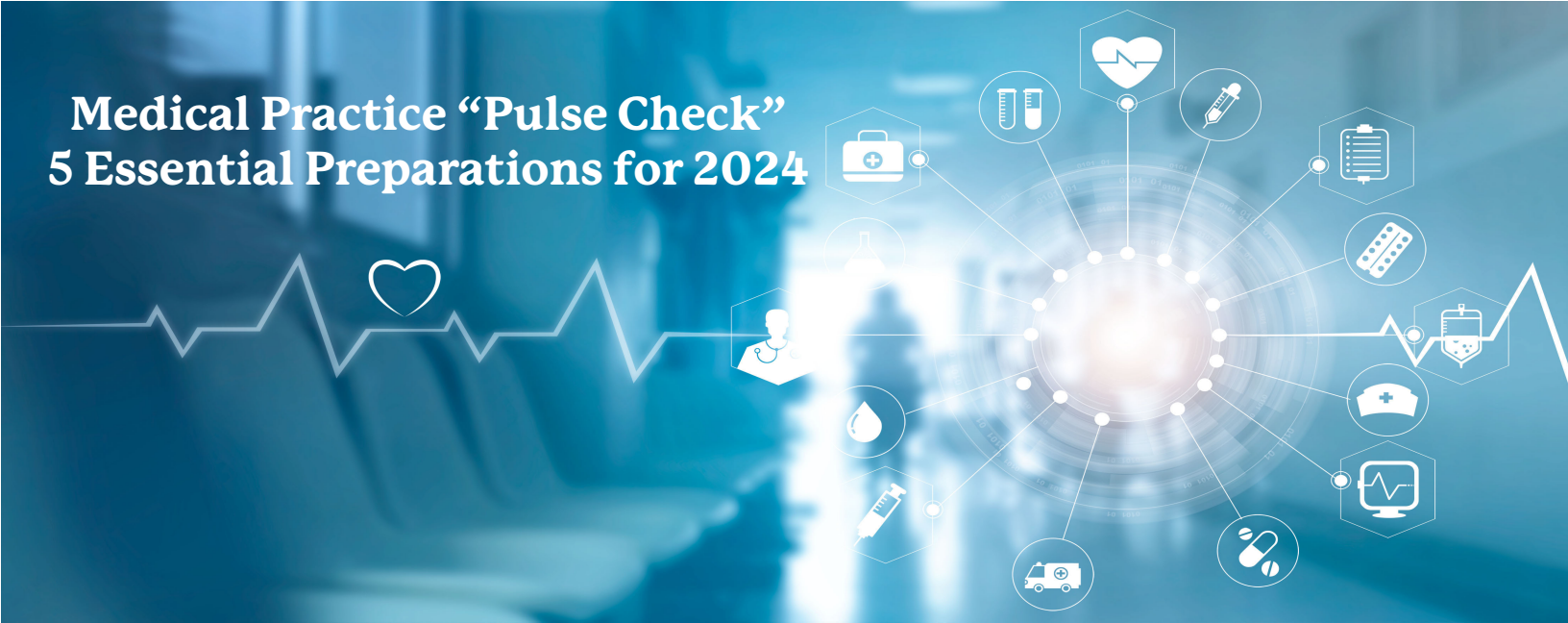


Medical Practice “Pulse Check” 5 Essential Preparations for 2024
